

Cultural Participation Through Gatherings

PAINS - NEEDS

People of low socioeconomic status are at risk of social exclusion. Social exclusion manifests itself when social inclusion, understood as the full social, cultural, political and economic participation, is not fully achieved.

The consequences of social exclusion are inequalities of opportunity and reduced well-being and it presents a threat to social cohesion. Cultural participation is an approach to counter social exclusion.



GAINS

Cultural participation serves as an approach to strengthen self-esteem, increase sense of belonging and to broaden societal perspectives.

Participation in cultural processes enhances cohesion, combats prejudices, increases satisfaction and can facilitate educational processes.

EXISTING PROBLEMS

Access to cultural participation is particularly difficult for people affected by poverty who are unable to take advantage of existing offers due to a lack of financial resources, networks and motivation.

THE CHALLENGE

In the form of a gathering or meeting, a creative and sustainable approach should be created, that is particularly responsive to the interests and needs of people affected by poverty.

Through low-threshold access and the creation of motivation, cultural participation can be increased, and educational processes made possible.
